Skills 2 Achieve subscription	£695	Skills2Achieve is a planning and assessment tool for physical education that tracks the progress of the whole child through a multi-ability approach to learning. It supports improving the health and wellbeing of pupils, helps to drive achievement and impacts whole school improvement.
Wild Tribe	£2700	This costs allows for all learners to be involved in Adventure Learning throughout the school year e.g. learning resilience through building shelters, developing esteem through protecting the environment and participating in team challenges.
Continuing Professional Development	£500	Courses specific to building teacher knowledge of PE
Local School Sports Partnership – based at Liskeard Community Secondary School	£1000	This has provided the infrastructure for organising our involvement in competitive sport. This membership also provides us with CPD opportunities tailored to our school needs.

### Impact:

### Staff CPD:

There was limited impact last year in terms of staff Continuing Professional Development. However, we have completed the following:

- Yr 5 & 6 received Bikeability training
- Termly PLT meetings for our PE Co-ordinator

### Ensure sustainable impact

- Up-skilling of staff – ensures that children continue to receive quality teaching beyond the two years of funding.
- Teachers who have attended courses has ensured subject knowledge is shared with colleagues.
- Bikeability – children in Y6 will leave with a basic understanding of road safety when cycling. This year we are investing in extra sessions to ensure all children that wish to have the opportunity to access the cycling training.
- Intra-school competitions – all children in the school who wish to will participate in inter-school competitions

### **Increase participation levels of all pupils**

- Interest in extra-curricular clubs has increased in both Key Stages due to the increase and variety of sporting activities. Each term the school will review the activities to ensure maximum participation by the children.
- Membership of the local Sports Network to give access to inter-school festivals, competitions and the Cornwall School Games.
- Links have been made with local clubs/schools to create further extra-curricular provision in football, rugby, tennis and cricket.

### **Quality resources:**

- Quality PE kit for all staff taking PE sessions.
- Ongoing replenishment of equipment.

### **What effect has the funding had so far?**

We frequently participate in local competitions and have achieved considerable success in inter-school competition

Learner enthusiasm and involvement is high, as reflected in the 59% of children that took part in the Big Pedal.

- 65% of KS2 pupils take part in after school clubs
- 67% of KS1 pupils take part in after school clubs
- 20% of KS1 pupils took part in inter school competitions
- 25% of KS2 pupils took part in inter school competitions
- 60% of KS2 children are now swimming confidently
- 56% of Y6 pupils can swim 25 metres plus
- Our rugby team qualified for the Cornwall School games
- Staff confidence in teaching PE has increased as a result of working alongside experienced coaches.
- 12 children qualified for the final of the Cornwall Games.
- Staff knowledge and understanding of teaching sport has increased and attitudes are very positive

- Bikeability was organised for all of our Y6 pupils. All can now ride confidently and have an understanding of basic road safety when cycling
- 100% of pupils took part in a School Sports Day with very positive responses from parents
- Lunch time activities led by the Higher Progress and Engagement Guide and Commado Joe provided support for all pupils
- 100% of KS1/2 pupils took part in a weekly “Wake and Shake” programme

An increasingly higher quality of Physical Education lessons are being taught by all staff. Evidence of this has been observed by our leadership team.

So far, we believe that the approach to sport in Liskeard Hillfort Primary School is positive with both staff and children. We are becoming more successful in a range of inter school events.
